THE FORT LEE SATELLITE COMMAND AND GENERAL STAFF OFFICER'S COLLEGE CAMPUS

The Fort Lee satellite campus for the Command and General Staff Officer College (CGSOC) had its first class opening in 2006. Since its first graduating class of sixty-one officers, Fort Lee has seen over two thousand students receive a diploma. The Fort Lee Team 32 conducts three classes per year with each class lasting sixteen weeks. The faculty of Team 32 is comprised of senior retired officers from multiple sister services. It is a tight-knit group of diverse professionals who model leadership by constantly challenging status quo through professional and academic discourse. In addition, the faculty serve as adjunct professors, staff ride facilitators, conference presenters, and panel members.

The faculty represents five departments that use the Socratic and Adult Learning Methods that address the intermediate level continued professional development of the field grade officer. In general, the multi-disciplinary curriculum is focused on developing critical and creative thinkers who can adapt and thrive in ambiguous and ever-changing environments. Specifically, the Department of Joint, Interagency, and Multinational Operation's (DJIMO) and the Department of Tactics (DTAC) create a learning environment that supports understanding of Joint Interdependence and the implications of the Strategic, Operational, and Tactical levels of war. The Department of Logistics and Resources Operations (DLRO) addresses the force management process and the strategic agencies, documents and processes that guide Army change. The focus of the Department of Command and Leadership (DCL) curriculum centers on the transition of officers from direct level leadership to the organizational level. Lastly, the Department of Military History (DMH) is a parallel block that gives a broad perspective of the interplay between war and Western society, the nature of revolutionary military change, and through that perspective, some insights into the challenges and opportunities the US military faces today.

The Fort Lee experience is not exactly that of Fort Leavenworth, but the team has taken advantage of its location and superb support from CGSOC, Fort Lee, and the Army Logistics University to offer an educational experience that can be very personally and professionally rewarding for the students.
