



### Roles and Responsibilities at Echelon



**End State:** The Army establishes **secure Joint Force access** to ports, terminals, airfields, bases, and local resources, **during both competition and conflict**, providing a **global – yet regionally aligned – and scalable sustainment architecture** that ensures Joint freedom of maneuver – the burden is removed from units moving to the fight.



Deployment Readiness Exercises (DREs) are conducted unannounced or on limited notice to assess unit and installation deployment support capabilities

## Level III

Purpose

*Evaluates a unit's ability to alert, assemble, and conduct Soldier readiness tasks*

*Evaluates a unit's ability to conduct complete load-out operations and installation turn-in activities, supporting a limited notice deployment*

*Evaluates a unit's ability to conduct strategic movement by air or surface in support of a limited notice deployment*

*Scenarios will reflect the types of unit contingency missions and deployment modes assigned*

Key Activities

- Conduct Soldier Readiness Processing in accordance with AR 600-8-101
- Assemble key load teams (air and rail), TC-AIMS II operator, and a HAZMAT certifier
- Verify appointment orders are current
- Verify required training certificates are on-hand to conduct all relevant functions
- Inspect Unit Movement Officer books for appointment orders, training certificates, recall rosters, organizational equipment lists, transportation requests, BBPCT requirements, convoy SOPs for movement to the POE, vehicle and container marking SOPs, and complete load plans for each vehicle, trailer, container, and 463L pallet
- Ensure a commander-approved generic Unit Deployment List (UDL) is loaded into TC-AIMS II

- Load containers and inspect relevant documentation
- Procure BBPCT instructions for use during containerization
- Prepare vehicles for all modes of travel and inspect documentation, to include marking and weighing
- Execute local or internal area movement requests and material handling equipment support
- Execute convoy movements that support the deployment plan
- Ensure a commander-approved UDL is submitted into the Computerized Movement Planning and Status System by the ITO

- Prepare unit for deployment to participate in all designated training
- Deploy unit after completing Soldier Readiness Processing
- Execute training mission before redeploying to home station
- Ensure a commander-approved UDL is executed
- Unit will execute procedures for the air movement of passengers short of the actual allocation of aircraft even if only unit equipment is moving by surface or is loaded on a strategic sea vessel
