The Army's logistics capacity is leveraged through three primary authorities:

Executive Agent (EA) Responsibilities

Tasks come with the authority to budget against a responsibility, such as resourcing for contingency operations.



Secretary of the Army

Provide specific support based on capability gaps, such as:

Health Services

Health Surveillance **Explosives Safety** Management



Command Authority of a Combatant Commander

Specified in Theater Campaign Plans to support operational efficiency - often delegated to the dominant force provider. Engage components using directive authority for logistics (DAFL)

















Army Service Component Commands


Assign Army as common user logistics (CUL) lead




Army Support to Other Services (ASOS) highlights the foundational nature of the Army's logistics support to the Joint Force

Theater Sustainment Commands (TSCs) are assigned to Army **Service Component** Commands (ASCCs) serving as the theaterlevel HQ for Joint logistics responsibilities.
