

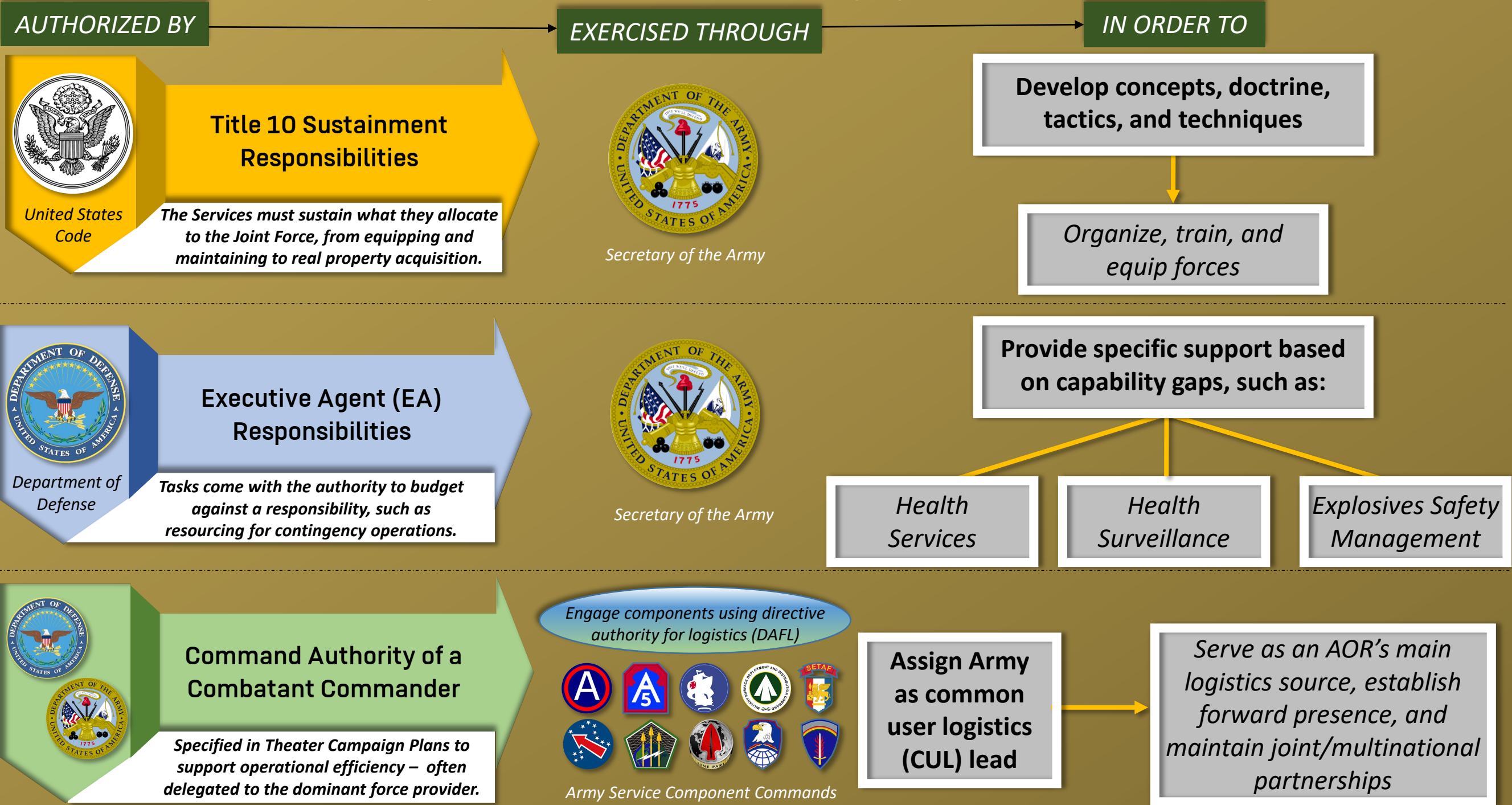

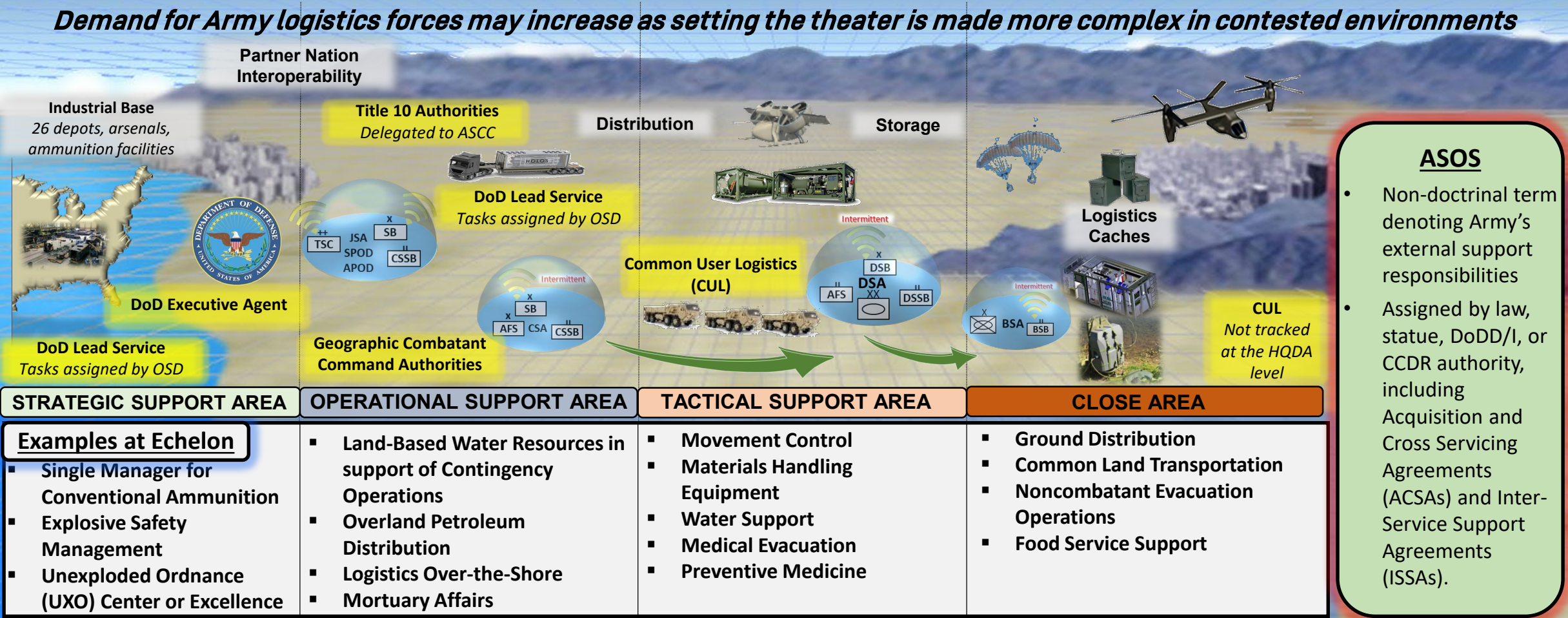

The Joint Force relies on Army resources and capabilities to enable decisive action by extending its operational reach, ensuring freedom of action, and prolonging tactical endurance.



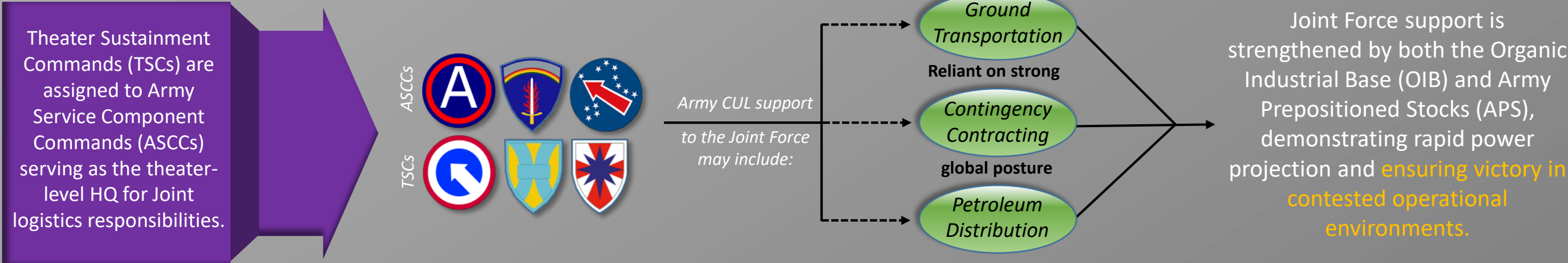

ASOS

- Non-doctrinal term denoting Army's external support responsibilities
- Assigned by law, statute, DoDD/I, or CCDR authority, including Acquisition and Cross Servicing Agreements (ACSAs) and Inter-Service Support Agreements (ISSAs).
