



Chief of Staff, Army, Award for Maintenance Excellence (AAME) Program



The Chief of Staff, Army Award for Maintenance Excellence (AAME) Program was instituted in 1982 to recognize exceptional maintenance programs implemented by Active Army, Army National Guard, and Army Reserve units. This prestigious honor is bestowed upon units demonstrating exemplary maintenance standards, directly contributing to increased operational readiness and enhanced mission capability. Moreover, the AAME serves as a gateway, positioning top units to compete within the Secretary of Defense's Maintenance Awards Program. This program encompasses the Phoenix Award and the Robert T. Mason Award, representing the Department of the Army's highest recognition for Field-level and Depot-level maintenance. The AAME program is comprise of nine categories, three Active Duty MTOE, two National Guard MTOE, two Army Reserve MTOE, a TDA, and the Depot category.
